linked to Climate Change and the Global Goals.







Ensure my child attends school on time and ensure my child has a good night rest so they are ready for school the next morning.	Article 28: you have the right to a good quality education	Make sure I am organised and ready for school. Try my best at school. Ask for help if I need it.
Provide healthy nutritious food, clean clothing and a safe environment.	Article 27: you have the right to food clothing and a safe place to live.	Try different foods if they are healthy. Make sure I look after myself
Ensuring no one is allowed to punish my child in a cruel or harmful way.	Article 30: You have the right to play and rest.	Treat all members of the school community with respect. Make I play in a safe and careful way. Try to play a range of different games
Take an interest in my child's participation in school life and encourage them to join in a wide range of activities both during and after school.	Article 29: Your education should help you develop and use your talents.	Trying new clubs. Practising my talent/ hobby.
